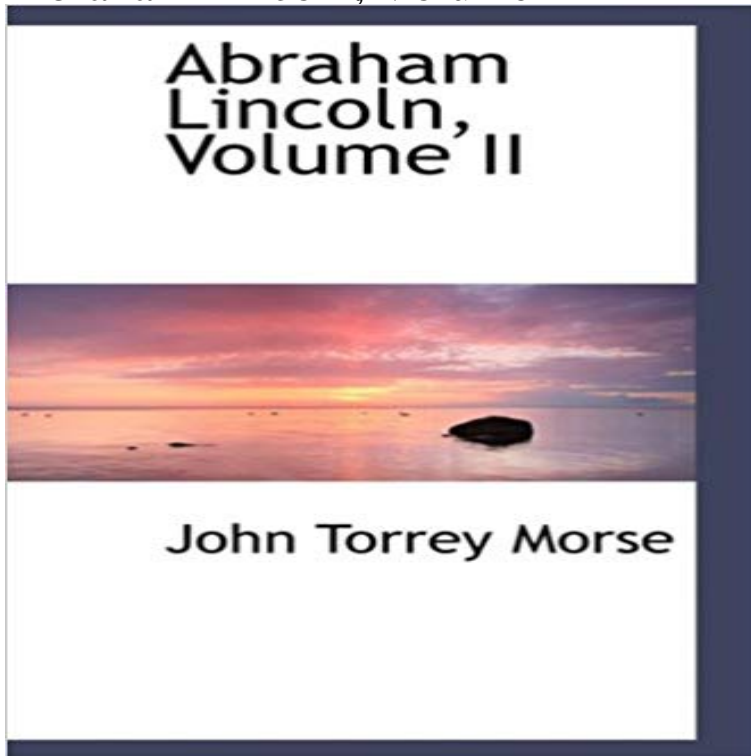


Abraham Lincoln, Volume II
