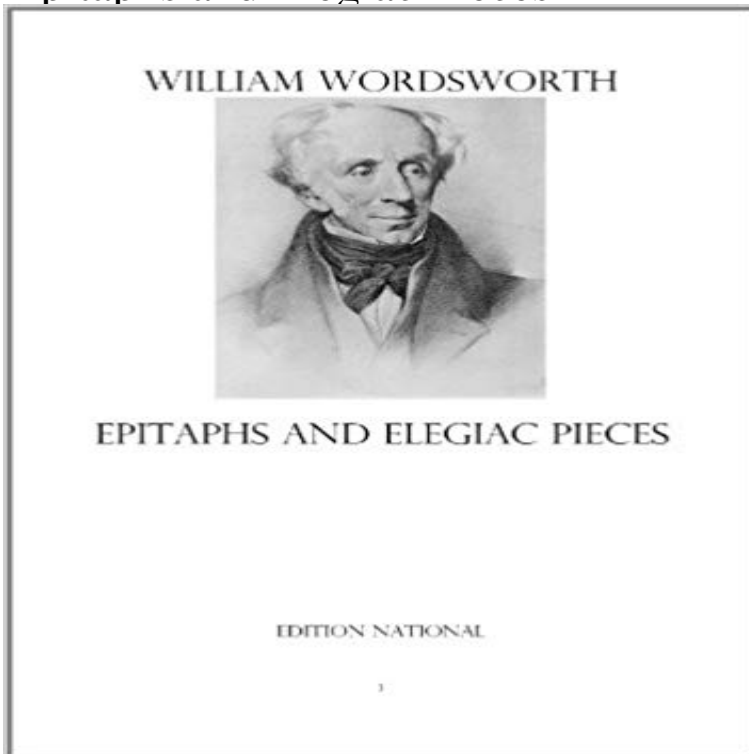


## Epitaphs and Elegiac Pieces
